Documentation Guidelines for TCS tudents with Disabilities <u>Mental Health Disabilities</u>

A mental disorder is a syndrome characterized by clinically significant disturbance in an individual's cognition, emotional regulation, or behavior that reflects a dysfunction in the psychological, biological, or developmental processes underlying mental functioning. Mental disorders are usually associated with signant distress or disability in social, occupational, or other important activities. An expectable or culturally approved response to a commonostress or loss, such as the death of a loved one, is not a mental disorder. Notes to mental health provider: The documentation must be in a typewritten report on professional letterhead that bears the evaluator's name, license number, professional credentials, business location, contact information an<u>dignature</u> Additionally, include the evaluator's business card. ## APPENDIX

Assessments for Mental Health Disorders in Adolescents and Adults This appendix contains selected examples of tests and instruments that may be used to supplement the clinical interview and support the prese of functional limitations. All tests used should be current and have sufficient reliability, validity, and utility for the specific purposes for which they are being employed. All tests should be normed edevant populations and results reported in standard scores and percentile ranks. Tests that have build be or indicators are preferred over those that do not.

Rating scaleSelfrater or interviewerrated scales for categorizing and quantifying the nature of the impairment may be useful in conjunction with other data, but no single test or subtest should be used solely to substantiate a diagnosis.
